Dear Gaesdonck families, dear parents

Even though this year is different than usual, this first weekend in advent will allow us to slowly get into the mood for the upcoming Christmas season and the turn of the year. Perhaps the restrictions imposed by the Corona pandemic will give us a completely unaccustomed opportunity to take these weeks of reflection a little easier than usual.

Also this week we can report that we are still not aware of any acute Covid-19 infections in our school and boarding school community. One factor that should not be underestimated is the extremely careful and responsible way in which our parents are dealing with this situation. Particularly when Gaesdonck pupils are classified by the health authorities as contact category 2, for example because siblings had contact with an infected person in kindergarten, and by that are formally allowed to attend school, many parents still contact us to discuss individual procedures and safety measures. By that we were often able to find good individual solutions with distance learning until the infection situation was clarified. We would like to thank all parents and teachers involved for this **shared responsibility**!

Early Christmas holidays

After the numerous press releases in the past few days, this week the Ministry of Education in Düsseldorf officially announced that the last two days before the originally planned start of the Christmas holidays are free of lessons. These are **Monday**, **21.12.2020** and **Tuesday**, **22.12.2020**. This means that the Christmas holidays will start on Friday, 18.12.2020 after the 6th lesson. With this decision the state government wants to give families the opportunity to reduce their social contacts in the run-up to Christmas.

At the same time, the Ministry of Education grants schools the opportunity to take a tests or oral exams in the upper school on these days. As things stand at present, this will not be necessary in our case.

If necessary, we offer emergency care for pupils in Years 5 and 6 on the two days when classes are not in session. This also extends to the Monday afternoon for pupils in day boarding schools. For reasons of planning security, we would like to ask you to apply for any necessary care using the official form linked [here] as soon as possible by 06.12.2020. If a short-term need arises after this deadline, we will certainly find a solution. Please note that the buses will not run on these two days.
